dolling up Sutro's like a shooting gallery, Whitney has carpenters and painters crawling on the ter-

raced levels. He is modernizing Sutro's in spots where it needed a face-lifting, but has the good sense to retain its Victorian charm.

The stuffed birds and dead

There is an exceptionally clear picture of the synagogue where the 450 Sutter Building

swim tanks. Manager Bratton has installed a colored area of blue in what passes for the infield.

"The blue is for the figure skaters," he explains. "The outfield around the rim is for

Owner Whitney hasn't gotten around to improving the swim tanks, though he will in time, He promises to install heated cubicles in the dressing rooms.

The swim suit counter will be moved downstairs to the tank level for greater convenience. Heretofore, you picked up your suit and towel on the third story of Sutro's many terraces. An-

Mgr. Bratton tells us the cold tank is fresh water, of "building temperature." Not having tried it, we thought it was salt water, fresh from the ocean at .5 degrees.
