ESTATE FIGHT

Trust Company Declares Mrs. Grinbaum Incurable, Incompetent to Manage Affairs

The Mercantile Trust Company, guardian of the \$1,800,000 estate of 74-year-old Mrs. Julie Grinbaum, yesterday filed an answer and opposition in the Superior Court to the petition of Mrs. Grinbaum and her niece, Mrs. Erna A. Herscher, Mrs. Grinbaum's personal guardian for restoration of the aged woman to competency.

The Mercantile Trust Company asserts that Mrs. Grinbaum is suffering from "dementia praecox" and is incurably insane; that she never will be able to manage her own affairs.

INCURABLE SHOWN. The time of the death of Morris Grinbaum, the woman's husband, the estate was worth \$233,000. Under the management of the Mercantile Trust Company, it has grown to \$1,800,000, the petition states.

In the opposition filed by the trust company it sets forth that in 1912 in Germany, Mrs. Grinbaum was adjudged insane by a court of law. Judge Frank H. Dunne has set the date for the trial as March 5 and it will be before a jury.

NEVLAN STATEMENT. In a statement commenting on the verdict, Attorney John Francis Nevlan said yesterday:

THE SOCIETY HELPS 15,395

Recognition of the value and importance of the work accomplished by the "Travelers' Aid Society" during the past year was voiced at the eighth annual meeting of the organization at the Commercial Club yesterday at which reports were read and officers for the year elected.

Archbishop Edward J. Hanna declared that the real naturalization problem of the United States was the proper meeting of the immigrants from foreign lands and advice and help in getting them comfortably settled.

Mrs. William Matson, president of the society, reviewed the society's accomplishments during the past year. "Travelers' Aid work has grown to such an extent that it is protective and crime preventative, he declared.

In presenting her annual report, Mrs. Suzanne C. Gomez, executive secretary, reported that 15,395 cases were handled by the society during the past year. Fourteen workers employed by the organization met 30,872 incoming trains and 869 steamers which reached San Francisco during the past twelve months.

Police Seize Coal For Citizen's Homes

SARATOGA SPRINGS (N. Y.), Feb. 12.—The contents of two of the nine carloads of anthracite seized in the Delaware valley by city police and taken under the direction of Dr. Arthur J. Leonard, public safety commissioner, tonight returned in bins of householders. Preparations were being made to complete the unloading tomorrow. The seven remaining cars are under police guard in the railroad yards. Detectives are co-operating with representatives of the fuel administrator's office to prevent seizure of coal at Bullton Spa, where residents today seized a trainload of anthracite stowed on a car and carried to the city. Bins in sheds, automobiles baskets and bags in front of police intervened.
